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Boldr. Message from Our Founder

2022 has been quite the year for Boldr and our Community.

In August of 2022 I made my first trip back to the Philippines since November 2019. Upon my return to the Philippines I was delighted to connect with the team, but also shocked by the radical impact COVID-19 had on the Philippine economy, Manila, and our team members' lives. Aside from the amount of grief experienced, there was a tremendous impact to the Philippine economy. In 2021 the Philippines recorded 163,879 visitors compared to the 8.26 million visitors in 2019. While COVID-19 has deeply impacted the entire world, I do believe that it shook the Philippines' more than any other market Boldr operates in.

I am grateful to have been working with an incredible leadership team that supported us and took care of our team members while serving the community. One of my proudest moments in 2022, was when

Boldr deployed our first ever Theory of Change.

Thank you Glo and your wonderful team of Impact leaders. We have spent a significant amount of time redesigning how we create and measure impact across our Theory of Change (TOC). In 2023, you will see us reorient ourselves to this Theory of Change. We will measure and report out our Impact across our 3Cs using our TOC. Stay tuned.

I am proud to announce our partnership with the Anker Institute. They represent the global approach to Living Wage. Other partners include Patagonia and Adidas. We are proud to be listed among them.

In addition, I'd like to share gratitude for the following people who helped us think through how to approach our Theory of Change anew: Michael Ventura, Tom Fels, Suneet Bhatt, and Steve Goldenberg.

Theory of Change Community

A Theory of Change framework clarifies the activities, resources, enabling conditions, and the intended outcomes of the beneficiaries of a specific intervention and illustrates the logical relationship across these factors. Using Boldr's Theory of Change for Community as an example, we started with a hypothesis that underpins all the strategies that drive change:

Everyone has the right to decent work and education. However, access to training and jobs remain unequally spread globally. Providing access to digital skills training, decent work, and a living wage can help address systemic unemployment and poverty in disadvantaged communities.

How does Boldr's business model as an outsourcing company help create access to training, jobs, and living wages? We answered this through three Impact pillars in our **Theory of Change:**

- Investing in communities to build or partner with training centers for digital skills
- Employing individuals who graduate from our training partners
- Paying living wages to all Boldr team members and employees in all regions

The challenge: Communities need access to opportunities.

The solution: Boldr invests in communities where talent abounds.



Our Theory of Change in 2022

From when we started our Theory of Change in 2021, we created access to training opportunities for 36 individuals in Cape Town and Hazyview through three training partners. 31 out of the trainees transitioned into employment, 11 of which are based in Hazyview and were absorbed into Boldr's Barksdale team. In the Philippines, Boldr partnered with two training centers with a collective cohort of 42 trainees. Finally, we have identified the first Impact Sourcing training school in Merida, which we are working to launch in the first quarter of 2023.



Our Living Wage work is progressing through a phased approach. After leveraging institutional and research collaborations with the Anker Institute, Boldr is rolling out its living wage, starting with the Philippines where 89% of team members are found to be earning above the locally prescribed living wage. By Q1 of 2023, Boldr aims to ensure that 100% of all team members in the Philippines are earning a living wage. From there, we will roll out the phase of Boldr's living wage work into Merida, and then, Cape Town, and Hazyview.





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BPO Jobseekers Training Hub Webinar

Boldr was invited by Bagosphere, a human skills development platform that accelerates career readiness and career growth, to speak to a group of job seekers that will help them ace interviews and land jobs. 




Cauayan North Central School Internet Sponsorship

Boldr sponsored the monthly internet subscription of Cauayan North Central School from April to December 2022. The Cauayan North Central School is the second largest elementary school in the Division of Cauayan City. It is home to the production site of modules and has its own recording studio for producing video lessons. Through its proactiveness in pursuing the Sustainable Development Goals, the school has close ties to the division office and the local government of Cauayan.

ALS Chairs Donation Kathrine Reyes

The ALJC-Acts Evangelism is a fully accredited Alternative Learning System (ALS) center by the Philippine Department of Education. Even though it is considered to be a community learning center, it is not funded by the government. The center is working under the Philippine law, which allows learning facilitators funded by private sectors or nonprofit organizations to help in providing non-formal education. The learners are mostly out-of-school youth, each one with different stories, backgrounds, and reasons why they were unable to pursue their studies in the past. Kathrine Reyes, the proponent of this Impact project, saw the opportunity to bring new life to the ALS learners and to help make studying more convenient for them.

Boldr was able to donate 50 chairs, a printer, and bond paper to the center. The learners are now able to sit comfortably and print out their modules without having to spend their money on printing outside the learning center.

The Chaeli Campaign Alex Peña

Boldr partnered with Chaeli Cottage Preschool to create a fully inclusive space in which preschoolers can learn by playing together. The preschool has a total of 21 students, 10 of which have disabilities. There are 3 teachers and 3 therapists (occupational therapist, speech pathologist, and physiotherapist) who give them proactive support.

Children start at age 3, then go on to Grade 1 in schools that cater to their specific needs. Early Childhood Development is an under-valued, under-estimated and essential phase of every child's education, more so for children with disabilities. Because we don't want money to be the barrier that denies them access to a quality education, most of the children with disabilities' fees are subsidized.






The Hope Foundation Sibonisiwe Mrwarwaza

Boldr is a global company that favors global mobility, so we are excited to have partnered with Instituto Nacional de Migración (INM), a unit of the government of Mexico, dependent on the Secretariat of the Interior that controls and supervises migration in the country. More than 30 immigrants are staying at INM. Accomplishing this project meant making a positive impact on vulnerable communities, in this case, immigrants pursuing better life opportunities.

Board games, soccer balls, volleyballs, puzzles, magazines, books, toys, pillows, and hygiene products were donated to the community. Our volunteer team members felt closer to the group that is often looked down upon, and made them more attentive to their specific needs, and supportive of local causes.

Arise

Arise is an empowerment group for women who have lost their jobs during COVID-19. Using their existing skills (knitting & sewing), they create items and sell them to earn an income for themselves. During the pandemic, they saw great suffering in their community, especially in the form of hunger and unemployment, so they started a feeding scheme with their small income to provide meals to residents within their community. In addition, they began teaching other women and youth how to knit and sew, so they could also create an income for their families.

Boldr supported Arise by donating knitting needles, a knitting machine, pots for cooking, a gas stove and wool to help them generate a larger income, which will be spread across their feeding scheme, skills development plan and their families. They were able to run an additional feeding scheme using their new pots and gas stove, which fed more community members than before.

We have also contracted them to knit Boldr merchandise, which we will buy from them once completed. These proaceeds will be used to buy supplies for their next feeding run.



As of today, they are still recuperating from the downfall of sustainable income. Through a team member's proposal and the help of 4 team member volunteers, we were able to donate 43 pieces of school bags and food packs for the elementary pupils of Don Vicente Quintero Memorial School who are also the children of Brgy. Apitong's pedicab drivers.








Pasko nAPO: A Gift Giving for Pedicab Drivers Maria Criselda Cayanes

Most of the Tinananon children do not have access to toys and reading materials for learning. By doing this project, we are creating a safe space for them to experience childhood and for them to grow and learn as a child. CPU Repair for Tacloban City Jail

The Tacloban City Jail Female Dormitory received 5 computer sets from Boldr in 2021. The said desktop computers are utilized mainly for the electronic visitation (e-dalaw) of 49 Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDL), online seminars/webinars for the PDL, video editing, creation of publicity materials and tarpaulin layout, encoding and making of reports, and other office documents.

After two years of sustained use, the four CPUs of the said desktop computers malfunctioned mainly due to defective power source. As such, Boldr has assisted the Tacloban City Jail to have these CPUs repaired immediately to continuously facilitate the programs and activities for the PDL.

Boldr Outdoor Club Mt. Balagbag Hike

In July, 2022, the Boldr Outdoor Club teamed up with the Impact team on a mission to ascend Mount Balagbag, a part of the Sierra Madre mountain range in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan. Eco Explorations, in partnership with Philippine Parks and Biodiversity, was granted an agreement with the government to reforest a 30-hectare area in Mount Balagbag and employed a team of forest rangers who are focused on nursery management, forest restoration, and protection.

Our Boldranians planted a total of 20 native trees in the forest's reforestation area and each team member also learned how to properly set the seedlings and had a chance to name each after them. Before leaving, the team thanked and handed over five sacks of 25 kilograms rice to each of the five rangers who guided them through the hike.

The Plastic Flamingo Collection

In an effort to combat environmental degradation, Boldr partnered with The Plastic Flamingo (PLAF) to help tackle marine plastic pollution through collecting, recycling, and upcycling plastic from commercial establishments. PLAF collects all types of plastic from various collection points, the Boldr Manila office included, and ships the collected plastic to their warehouse, where they segregate and condition the High-Density Polyethylene Plastic Type (HDPE), Low-Density Polyethylene Plastic Type (LDPE), and Polypropylene Plastic Type (PP) plastics and transform them into Eco-Planks.

These Eco-Planks serve as piles and pontoons to secure habitats above rising sea level, or as emergency shelters for populations hit by disasters. Last September we collected 51.6 kg worth of plastics. This was diverted from the ocean and landfills, then upcycled into plastic materials for building sustainable shelters.

Typhoon Odette Response

On March 5, Boldr, with the support of other organizations, held a Typhoon Odette Response for the Municipality of San Juan in Southern Leyte. The municipality is composed of 18 barangays and home to some 3000 households or 4500 families. We donated 500 jugs of 5 gallon purified drinking water and 79 water filters from Waves for Water that will last for at least 5 years. Each water filter provides clean drinking water for a hundred people and these will be monitored regularly to ensure that the filters are well maintained.

We also distributed 250 food packs of goods from Aboitiz Foundation and Our Lady of Fatima Parish to six (6) evacuation centers in San Juan. An assortment of kitchen and bathroom items from ACLC were also donated.

This family now has the basic needs to feel comfortable and is able to rest dry and warm after a hard day's work.

Campus de Ciencias Biologícas y Agropecuarias (CCBA) is a school in Merida founded in 1970. The school initially offered degrees in Veterinary Medicine and Zootechnics, later, in 1985, it began to offer a degree in Biology and later, in 2006, the Degree programs in Agroecology and Marine Biology were incorporated. A group of students from the Biological and Agricultural Sciences department of CCBA formed a charity organization for animals called Perritos CCBA. Their aim is to work together to create awareness about dogs and cats living on the streets of Merida, Yucatan. They provide shelter to pets and eventually find them a safe and loving home. Last December 2022, Boldr donated 100 kilograms of dog food to the charity and it was able to benefit at least 15 dogs from their shelter.

Making a difference resonates with <u>Boldr's approach to impact-driven outsourcing</u>, which includes consistently giving back to the communities where we are operating. And because impact forms part of our ethos, it is no surprise that our global teams were excited to celebrate Mandela Day. Here is more about what they got up to.

Mexico

Our passionate Mexican team was so determined to help those in need that they decided to help out at Refettorio Merida. The Refettorio kitchen requires around 3kg (6-7lb) of vegetables every day to prepare meals, so they decided to donate 67kg (30lb) vegetables and volunteer at the soup kitchen for 67 minutes. And since the kitchen received another large donation of products (beans, rice, sauces, jam, etc.), they also helped with the classification of all the items.



Because the team has a soft spot for their furry friends, they also volunteered to help out at a local pet shelter for 67 minutes, as well as donating 67kg (30lb) of dog and cat food to the shelter.

Philippines

By partnering with the Our Lady of Fatima Parish Church in Tacloban City, the local Boldr Philippines team targeted donations for an incredibly poor Filipino community. They donated 15kg of rice to 67 households from Barangay Taguictik, San Jose. Beyond this, they gave a further 6kg of rice to 25 pedicab drivers from the same community.



In Manila, the local team worked with the Philipine General Hospital Department of Pediatrics. This department attends to over 62,000 patients annually, of which the majority comes from the country's poorest households. They donated 67 children's books, 67 boxes of kiddies face masks, 6 toys, and 7 tabletop games. We also provided 276 donuts and 201 juice packs as snacks for the department's 84 patients, 50 staff, and general wards.

This is our second year of donating to this hospital department. In 2021, we donated 67 activity/hygiene kits, each including a storybook, coloring pad, pen, eraser, crayons, soap, and sanitizers.

- Hosted a skills workshop at <u>Ikamva Youth</u>, which runs satellite programs in Nyanga and Khayelitsha




What is Feminism Anyway


Transgender Women Are Women






